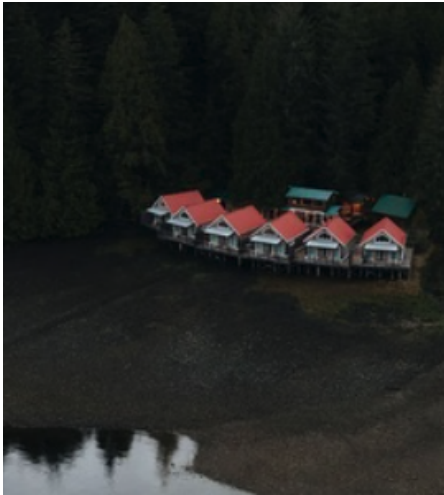


Do Not Disturb

NIMMO BAY: WHERE WILD LUXURY WHISPERS



There are few places left in the world where silence still belongs to nature. Where wilderness is not an escape but a return. Nimmo Bay is one of those places.

Accessible only by air or sea, Nimmo Bay rests quietly within British Columbia's Great Bear Rainforest. It is a retreat designed not for the masses but for the mindful. This is not just privacy by geography. It is privacy by philosophy. Here, the only schedule that matters is nature's. The only neighbours are trees, whales, and those you have chosen to share the moment with.

Guests may choose to buy out the entire property, and in doing so, unlock more than a destination. They claim a living piece of the Pacific Northwest, a floating wilderness sanctuary

where cedar boardwalks wind through forest and over water, and each step feels like a step inward.

Shedding the City

At Nimmo Bay, everything invites you to slow down. The pace is set not by clocks but by tides and light. Guests are gently encouraged to shed the city, to tune in to the rhythms of the forest and the breath of the ocean.

There is no fixed agenda. Days unfold with softness and intention. One morning may begin with a cold plunge in glacier-fed water, followed by a cedar sauna ritual and a forest-foraged breakfast. Another might lead to waterfall hikes, ocean paddling, or hands-on culinary sessions with chefs who know the taste of the land.

Wellness here is not a programme. It is a feeling. One that flows through every detail and every choice. Guests co-create their stay with Nimmo's experience team who intuitively shape each moment around personal curiosity and pace. Some seek the thrill of heli-accessed adventure. Others seek stillness. All are met with warmth and care.

This is not a place that pushes. It holds. Space to breathe. Time to listen. Permission to just be.

Sustainability as Stewardship

Nimmo Bay has always been more than a lodge. It is a family legacy and a living commitment to the land. Long before sustainability became a hospitality trend, the Murray family was crafting a model of balance and respect. In the early 1980s, they built a small hydroelectric system powered by the property's own waterfall. That system still provides the majority of the resort's energy today.

Every corner of Nimmo Bay reflects a gentle footprint. Floating cabins reduce land impact. Cedar walkways protect the forest floor. Structures are built from locally sourced materials. Interiors are curated with longevity in mind, favouring antiques and handcrafted pieces over fast furniture.

There are no single-use plastics. Mountain-fed water is UV-purified and served in glass bottles. Refillable amenities come from small, women-owned businesses. The lodge shop supports Indigenous makers and Canadian artisans. Even the uniforms speak a story, sourced from a local circular fashion brand focused on natural fibres and recycled textiles.

Food is a celebration of place. The culinary team works with small-scale fisheries and farms across Vancouver Island. Ingredients are seasonal, sustainable, and often gathered just steps away. Menus honour the environment and the culture that sustains it.

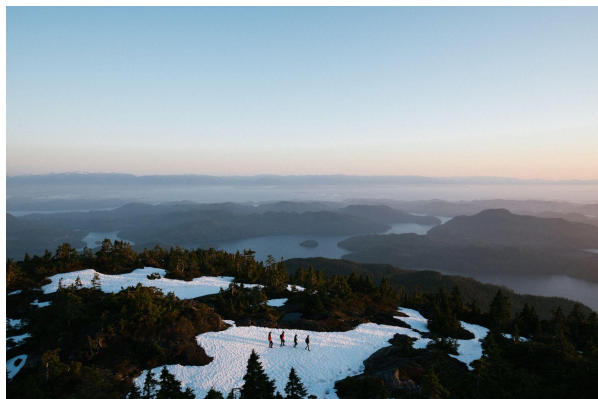
This is what responsible luxury looks like. Beauty without burden. Elegance without excess. Every element deeply considered. Every choice rooted in care.
